

Summary of Responses:

State	Use of Signs	Successful Practices
Illinois	Respondent not aware of signs or programs.	Maintenance crews pick up litter. The agency is considering Ohio DOT's approach of contracting out litter collection.
New York	The state's Adopt-A-Highway program has had varying success and is not encouraged on interstates for safety purposes. Oversight is needed to ensure that the adopting group: • Has a valid permit to conduct activities on the state right of way. • Receives safety briefing, personal protective equipment and bags. Other requirements include: • Coordinating the pickup of litter bags. • Biannual litter pickups for all Adopt-A- Highway permittees. Permitted group names appear on a supplementary panel below the Adopt-A-Highway 2-mile sign panel (see the sign image on page 2).	Not addressed
Ohio	The respondent provided the image of a sign that appears on page 2.	Not addressed
Utah	The agency discontinued its Adopt-A-Highway (AAH) volunteer litter pickup program and is removing all AAH signage from the right of way as projects are awarded. A new Keeping UT Beautiful program allows volunteer groups to participate in one-time cleanups on roadways; no signs are involved. Signs are available for businesses participating in the Sponsor-A-Highway program where the business pays for professional litter cleanup on the sponsored road segment; see the sign examples on page 2.
