Query:	Which state reported the use of a noncommercial license by agency CDL operators that does not allow the holder to drive commercially or out of state?	

Summary of Responses:

These state transportation agency respondents require a CDL:

- California
- Connecticut
- Indiana
- Ohio

The *Maryland DOT* respondent reported that the agency considered allowing intrastate CDL drivers to have a noncommercial license but did not implement the practice. Maryland <u>Motor Vehicle Administration policy</u> states:

If you are a Maryland non-commercial driver operating a commercial motor vehicle within the State of Maryland (intrastate) and the vehicle weighs 10,001 and up to 26,000 pounds, you are required to have a valid MCSA-5876 - Medical Examiner Certificate in your possession. If you were licensed before October 1, 2003, have a preexisting medical condition, and the onset was prior to 10/01/03, you will be exempt from the requirement for a 20-year period, provided your preexisting condition does not worsen. You are still required to maintain a DOT physical.

The *New York DOT* respondent noted that while such a practice may be a legally viable option, the agency does not wish to explore it given the potential liability.
